We are all looking forward to getting going with our interactive learning next week. I can't stress enough the importance of **all** children logging in to their daily interactive sessions. School feels very different this time to last, as we are all working with our own class groups to keep moving forward with learning, as much as we can.

I hope that these sessions will become part of your child's daily routine, and to help them feel mentally more prepared for 'school' contact time I would like you to discuss and agree the following with your child.

Remote Learning and Contact Agreement

1. Be prepared and ready for your interactive session
 - Please wear your school sweatshirt or hoody.
 - Make sure you have a pencil / pen and anything your teacher has said you will need.
 - Sit at a table or desk so that you have space to learn. This should be in a communal home space, if possible.
 - Save snacks and drinks for other times in your day.
 - Be on time.
2. When you enter the lesson, your teacher will say hello and then ask you to mute yourself.
3. Raise your hand to speak. As in school, there should only be 1 person talking at a time, so that we can hear and value what others have to say (*you will be asked to unmute yourself to speak*).
4. Respect each other's ideas, opinions, appearance, privacy and learning.
5. Please keep your home background visible (No backgrounds of the Bahamas thank-you!)

You may still have an exercise book that you your child used to record their learning in from the last lockdown. If not, I will leave some exercise books in a lidded box by the school staff carpark gate, which you are welcome to come and collect.
